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Consent Form

This research project is being conducted by Prof. Ipek Türeli (Principal Investigator), Prof. David Theodore (Principal Investigator), Stephanie He (student researcher) and Zachary Mathurin (student researcher) of McGill University School of Architecture funded by FQRSC Grant, Start-up Funds and Summer Undergraduate Research in Engineering (SURE) fellowship.

We are inviting you to participate in a research study.

The project is co-sponsored by Profs. David Theodore and Ipek Türeli who are collaborating to develop a research centre that integrates digital history and institutional networks. It is part of a trial project focusing on the School of Architecture as an institution. The School provides professional training in architecture at the undergraduate level, but we do not know how our graduates use their education: What kind of careers paths do they take? How their education at McGill did shaped their lives? This information is crucial to our unit because we are a professional accredited school of architecture, but we have never conducted a study of our performance as an institute based on alumni trajectories.

We are asking you to fill out a questionnaire or allow us to conduct a single 15 minute interview (approximately). We would also like permission to use the data from your original autobiographies (i.e. the factual information such as places lived, travelled to, work experience if mentioned, etc.).

Should you give us consent, we will also record the interview and use this recording simply for transcription and use of accurate information.

We propose several degrees of confidentiality including: use of name and data on publications, anonymized (nameless) use of data on publications, collection of name and data which will not be published but kept within the research team, anonymized (nameless) collection of data which will not be published but kept within the research team or you may also choose not to participate. Should you choose to participate but do not wish to have your information published or associated to your name, the data we will collect will still be used by the research team to draw general conclusions and create statistics for comparisons between cohorts, with other schools, with other studies of this nature, etc. Should you choose to anonymize the information that you provide us with, the information in the autobiography, or both, this request cannot, of course, be withdrawn.

The collected data will be stored on a secure online server provided by McGill University's Information and Technology Department. It will only be accessible by Professor Ipek Türeli, Professor David Theodore, Stephanie He and Zachary Mathurin (student researchers, access until August 22, 2015). All data will be kept for 7 years following the completion of the project as per McGill's Policy on the Ethical Conduct of Research Involving Human Participants.

The data collected will help the School of Architecture learn about the effectiveness of its program. This type of selfassessment could lead to similar studies in other schools of architecture because of McGill's position as a leading institution of higher education. Architectural education typically creates one vision of the future for students; a professional practitioner working in an office or individually. However, with this visualization of the alumni trajectories, we will be able to not only map the ways in which architecture can be practiced, but the many applications this type of education can lead to in the wider professional realm. It will also allow professionals to view the vastness of their potential connections and discover new paths for their careers. The information in the database can be used to analyze trends in Canada's building industry. We will be able to see which aspects of our built environment are of lower quality and refocus both the education process and the profession to be able to bring up these areas and rehabilitate Canada's unique architectural landscape.
